ALBERTA RESPONDS

Alberta News, April 29, 2025

Premier Danielle Smith released the following statement following the re-election of a Liberal government in Ottawa.

I congratulate Prime Minister Mark Carney on his minority government election victory last night.

I also want to sincerely thank Pierre Poilievre for his powerful and principled advocacy against the last decade's punitive taxation and anti-resource policies that have made our country weaker, more divided and overly-dependent on the United States.

Mr. Poilievre's vision for a safer, more affordable, united and prosperous Canada drove the policy debate in this country for the last several years and has inspired millions to see the unique potential of our nation. While Liberals and New Democrats demeaned and demonized Albertans, our values and our industries for political gain, Mr. Poilievre made empowering Albertans and our energy sector a cornerstone of his campaign. His respect and admiration for Albertans could not have been clearer. He is and continues to be a true friend of Alberta.

As Premier, I invite the Prime Minister to immediately commence working with our government to reset the relationship between Ottawa and Alberta with meaningful action rather than hollow rhetoric. A large majority of Albertans are deeply frustrated that the same government that overtly attacked our provincial economy almost unabated for the past 10 years has been returned to government.

As Premier, I will not permit the status quo to continue. Albertans are proud Canadians that want this nation to be strong, prosperous, and united, but we will no longer tolerate having our industries threatened and our resources landlocked by Ottawa.

In the weeks and months ahead, Albertans will have an opportunity to discuss our province's future, assess various options for strengthening and protecting our province against future hostile acts from Ottawa, and to ultimately choose a path forward.

As Premier, I will facilitate and lead this discussion and process with the sincere hope of securing a prosperous future for our province within a united Canada that respects our province's constitutional rights, facilitates rather than blocks the development and export of our abundant resources, and treats us as a valued and respected partner within confederation.

Our government will be holding a special caucus meeting this Friday to discuss this matter further. I will have more to say after that meeting is concluded.



RCMP Alberta News, April 22, 2025

Drayton Valley RCMP makes arrests after multijurisdictional investigation

Drayton Valley, Alta. - On April 19, 2025, the Drayton Valley RCMP responded to a complaint of a home invasion with a firearm in Drayton Valley, with the victim having been transported to the Drayton Valley hospital. While members were gathering information about this complaint, they were dispatched to a secondary complaint of a male that had been stabbed multiple times at a rural property in Brazeau, County, Alta. After a thorough investigation, police determined that the two events were related and perpetrated by the same suspects. As a result of this investigation, the Drayton Valley RCMP executed a search warrant at a residence in Tomahawk, Alta., and Red Deer City RCMP assisted with executing a secondary search warrant in Red Deer, Alta. The two suspects were arrested in Red Deer by the RCMP Emergency Response Team, without incident.

Both suspects were known to police and both events were targeted, with no ongoing risk to the general public.

As a result of the investigation, the following were arrested:

Robert Blackwell (34), a resident of Red Deer, was charged with:

- Robbery with a firearm;
- · Breaking and entering;
- · Forcible confinement while using a firearm;
- Assault causing bodily harm (X3);
- Assault with a weapon (X3);
- Other firearm-related offences (x3);
- Other weapon-related offences (x8); and
- Failure to comply with court orders (X5).

Brittney Goulden (34), a resident of Tomahawk, was charged with:

- Robbery with a firearm;
- Breaking and entering;
- · Forcible confinement while using a firearm;
- Assault causing bodily harm (X2);
- Assault with a weapon (X2); and
- · Aggravated assault.

Blackwell and Goulden were brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. They are to appear at the Alberta Court of Justice in Breton, Alta., on April 23, 2025.

23ANDME BANKRUPTCY

Information and Privacy Commissioner highlights Albertans' privacy options following 23andMe bankruptcy filing Options include requesting that data be removed

from the 23andMe genetic services company platform

The Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta, Diane McLeod, is reminding Albertans to take steps to protect their personal information, in light of a recent bankruptcy filing in the United States.

Last month, the genetic services company 23andMe filed for bankruptcy in an American court. McLeod is taking this opportunity to inform Albertans about this matter and to encourage them to ensure their highly-sensitive personal information is protected from possible disclosure to an unknown source.

"Genetic information is one of the most sensitive types of personal information that exists," said McLeod. "Advances in the processing of the human genome, along with the falling price of genetic sequencing, mean that virtually anyone can obtain information about their ancestry, risk of hereditary diseases, and even psychological and behavioural predispositions such as risk of depression or sensitivity to addiction. While this has the potential to enable great advances in treatment, it also makes genetic information a valuable and desired asset. Any breach of such sensitive personal information not only affects that individual, but also members of their extended biological family."

The assets filed under the 23andMe bankruptcy include a vast amount of data derived from its genomic sequencing activities. Media reports indicate that 23andMe holds DNA samples where customers have chosen to leave them with the company and that it has received court approval for the sale of its assets, which include its data holdings.

"It is uncertain who will become the new owner of 23andMe and its assets, and what their intentions may be for the personal information obtained," said McLeod. "In this type of situation, it is important for people to know that they have a number of options to protect any personal information held by 23andMe."

Options include 23andMe users adjusting their settings to choose whether or not they wish to participate in research and share their data or participate in biobanking. They may also delete their account and genetic data on the 23andMe platform. This option is in the account settings under "23andMe" Data, "Permanently Delete Data." Users can select options to delete both their account and their genetic data.

Requests to destroy physical DNA samples and additional queries can be sent through the 23andMe

customer service portal: www.customercare.23andme.com/hc/enus/requests/new

In the past, the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta has issued guidance on genetic testing and privacy for Albertan consumers. It can be found here.

Through the OIPC, the Information and Privacy Commissioner performs the responsibilities set out in Alberta's three access to information and privacy laws, the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, the Health Information Act, and the Personal Information Protection Act. The Commissioner operates independently of government.




