

Household Hazardous Waste

These solid or liquid materials and gas containers have outlived their usefulness and could harm people or the environment. without special handling and treatment in how they are discarded. They can be flammable, corrosive, explosive or toxic and because of these dangerous characteristics should not be sent to the landfill or emptied into sewer systems. Household hazardous products in Canada display one or more of the following symbols:

Flammable - burn easily (painting wastes, degreasers, and other solvents).

Corrosive - "eats" away surfaces and skin (rust removers, alkaline cleaning fluids and old batteries).

Reactive/Explosive - react violently when mixed with other chemicals, under pressure or heat (aerosols).

Toxic/Poison - poison or cause damage to living organisms (materials containing heavy metals like mercury, lead or cadmium).

When a product displaying one or more of the warning symbols is discarded (after considering reuse possibilities), it should be disposed of properly. Examples of acceptable products at www.brazeau.ab.ca/county-office/events/news-and-publicnotices/household-hazardous-waste-roundup-may-25th-and-june-1st

In conjunction with the Hazardous Waste Roundup residents will also be allowed to bring large items and vard waste to the transfer stations on the same day. Items such as furniture, appliances, scrap steel and yard waste will be accepted. Some transfer stations accept scrap steel and appliances year round. Check for times and sites on www.brazeau.ab.ca

Tires unloaded by hand and removed from rims will be accepted again this year. Please do not bring in any tires from large industrial, commercial or agricultural equipment.

Very large items such as car bodies/parts, construction waste and commercial/industrial waste will not be accepted.

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
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


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

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DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP RESPONDS TO TWO-VEHICLE COLLISION

RCMP Alberta News, May 21, 2025

Drayton Valley, Alta. - At approximately 5:15 a.m. on May 20, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP responded to a complaint of a two-vehicle collision on Hwy 22 on the South side of Drayton Valley. The vehicles had been travelling Eastbound when they collided and one rolled over into the Westbound ditch. The driver of the vehicle in the ditch was extracted by Drayton Valley Fire Services and transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. Investigation revealed that the collision was due to a "road rage" incident, resulting in the arrest of the driver of the other vehicle. No other individuals were involved in the incident. The highway was partially closed, resulting in slow moving traffic, while RCMP collision analysts attended and conducted their investigation.

As a result of the investigation, Kevin Hornle (55), a resident of Drayton Valley, was charged with Dangerous operation causing bodily harm and Aggravated assault. He was brought before a justice of the peace and released on conditions. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on June 17, 2025.

"We would like to thank the public for their cooperation while we conducted our investigation" said Sgt Dan Ferri, Operations NCO for the Drayton Valley RCMP. "This is a good time to remind the public to be courteous on the road and always drive safely."

Voting Stations and Ballots for 2025 Municipal Election

Council gave all required readings to Bylaws 1208-25 and 1209-25.

Bylaw 1208-25 allows for the Returning Officer to designate more than one voting station per division for the 2025 Municipal Election, to allow for sufficient stations to allow for voter participation. Without the bylaw, there would only be one voting station per division. In some divisions based on geography or availability of facilities, only one voting station will be designated, while others may have two. Once the voting stations have been selected and secured they will be advertised to the public.

Bylaw 1209-25 allows for the printing of ballots in lots for the election. Printing ballots in lots allows each candidate to have their name appear on the top of the ballot an equal number of times. Historically, Brazeau County has had its ballots printed in lots for municipal offices in the election.

Property Tax Due Date in Case of Strike

Council extended the 2025 tax due date and residential tax incentive eligibility until July 31st in the event of a postal strike at Canada Post. More information will be forthcoming.

Council approved the paving overlay of Taxiway C at the Pembina Regional Aerodrome up to an amount of \$30,000, with funds coming from the Road Restricted

Reserve. The Town of Drayton Valley will also provide \$30,000 for the project.

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
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
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GRANTS TO GROW PRIMARY CARE

Alberta News, May 22, 2025

New grants totalling about \$25 million will support innovative, community-led projects to improve access to primary health care across Alberta.

Alberta's government is investing in made-in-Alberta solutions to strengthen the province's primary health care system, including Indigenous primary health care. These new grants will support projects that improve access, reduce administrative burdens and support team-based care so all people in Alberta can get the care they need, when and where they need it.

The grants are being awarded through two innovation-focused programs: the Primary Care Innovation Fund and the Indigenous Primary Health Care Innovation Fund. These funds will support 19 projects that will improve primary care, advance research and innovation and support community health priorities.

The \$5-million Primary Care Innovation Fund is supporting five projects that will help improve access to care, support early detection of dementia and other conditions, provide post-reproductive care for women, advance research and clinical trials, and harness the potential of artificial intelligence to improve health care services.

The \$20-million Indigenous Primary Health Care Innovation Fund is supporting 14 community-led initiatives, including virtual care clinics, cultural reconnection, facility upgrades and Elder care. The funding is flexible so Indigenous communities can address their specific priorities and support culturally appropriate care.

Both of the grant programs stem from a recommendation in the Modernizing Alberta's Primary Care System (MAPS) final report. MAPS was created to strengthen Alberta's primary health care system and ensure all people in Alberta have access to timely, appropriate care throughout their lives.

Indigenous Support Line

To further support access to primary care for Indigenous patients and families, the Indigenous Support Line will be expanded to Edmonton and Calgary on June 1. The phone line has supported more than 10,000 callers over the past three years with health system navigation, access to cultural supports, language services and more.

Operated by Health Link in partnership with the Indigenous Wellness Core, the line connects callers with health professionals who understand Indigenous ways of knowing and traditional healing practices.

The support line can also be utilized by front-line health care providers to assist in providing culturally appropriate care. Providers can use the support line to learn about cultural support services, Indigenous ways of knowing, traditional healing practices, access to ceremony and other services that may assist their patients.

 - Arthritis Society of Canada to implement a costeffective, Al-enhanced portable infant ultrasound screening for developmental dysplasia of the hip.
 - Dr. Kerry McBrien, University of Calgary to develop a community health navigator program to enhance team-based care, integrate social and community resources and improve access to care.
 - University Hospital Foundation to develop and implement an early diagnosis and care pathway for Albertans living with dementia.
 - Dr. Colleen Norris, University of Alberta to establish the Alberta Women's Post-Reproductive Health Centre to provide comprehensive primary care for midlife women.
- Indigenous Primary Health Care Innovation Fund grant recipients include:
 - Samson Cree Nation to establish the Nipisihkopahk Medical Clinic to provide the community with long-term access to equitable and comprehensive health care services.
 - Elizabeth Metis Settlement to support the Métis Lifeways Elders Care Initiative, including a comprehensive Elder care facility.
 - Stoney Nakoda Tsuut'ina Tribal Council Ltd. (G4)

 to evaluate the current state of non-insured health benefits coverage and financial implications.

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
