





A NEW APPROACH TO COVID-19 IMMUNIZATIONS

Alberta News, June 13, 2025

Alberta's government is transitioning its COVID-19 immunization program to a targeted program that prioritizes higherrisk Albertans first and reduces waste.

Due to changes to the federal COVID-19 vaccine procurement process earlier this year, provinces and territories are now responsible for purchasing COVID-19 vaccines for residents. Alberta's government remains committed to ensuring Albertans who are at highest risk due to COVID-19 have access to immunizations.

Starting this fall, Albertans who are at a higher risk of severe outcomes from COVID-19 will be able to access the vaccine through public health clinics in the province.

"In previous years, we've seen significant vaccine wastage. By shifting to a targeted approach and introducing pre-ordering, we aim to better align supply with demand – ensuring we remain fiscally responsible while continuing to protect those at highest risk." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Primary and Preventative Health Services

In the 2023-24 respiratory virus season, a total of just over one million COVID-19 vaccines were wasted, or 54 per cent of Alberta's order that year. Based on the Center for Disease Control costing estimates of \$110 per vaccine dose, this means that about \$135-million worth of vaccines were never used and were discarded.

Now that Alberta's government is responsible for procuring vaccines, it's important to better determine how many vaccines are needed to support efforts to minimize waste and control costs.

This new approach will ensure Alberta's government is able to better determine its overall COVID-19 vaccine needs in the coming years, preventing significant waste.

In the fall, the COVID-19 vaccine program will be rolled out in four phases, beginning with the highest-risk groups and gradually expanding to include more Albertans over time.

Phase 1:

Through Phase 1, provincially funded COVD-19 vaccines will be available free of charge to residents of seniors supportive living accommodations and home care clients.

Phase 2:

Through phases two, three and four, to prevent significant waste, the COVID-19 vaccine will only be available through public health clinics. Community pharmacies will no longer be administering COVID-19

vaccines.

In Phase 2, provincially funded COVID-19 vaccines will be available free of charge for:

- Those six months and older with underlying medical conditions or compromised immune systems, or in congregate living accommodations.
- Albertans on social programs (i.e. AISH, income supports, and individuals experiencing homelessness)

Phase 3:

Through Phase 3, the COVID-19 vaccine will be available to all Albertans 65 years and older. Albertans in Phase 3 will be required to cover the full costs of the vaccine. Work is underway to determine what the final cost will be per vaccine.

Phase 4:

Through Phase 4, remaining COVID-19 vaccines will be available to other Albertans who will be required to pay the full costs of the vaccine.

Starting Aug. 11, eligible Albertans will be able to signal their intent to receive the COVID-19 and influenza vaccines by pre-ordering through the Alberta Vaccine Booking System. Following the pre-order, Albertans will receive a reminder notification via text message or email prompting them to book their immunization appointment in early October. When individuals book their immunization appointment for fall/winter 2025-26, they can also pre-order their vaccine for 2026-27.

It is recommended Albertans talk to their primary care provider to determine what is the best course of action for their needs.

Quick facts:

- Recently, the Federal Drug Administration in the United States stopped recommending routine COVID-19 vaccines for pregnant women and healthy children.
- As of April 1, Alberta has taken over the responsibility for procuring and funding COVID-19 vaccines for the province.
 - Alberta will begin procuring COVID-19 vaccines annually through the National Bulk Purchasing Program.
- For the 2025-26 season, approximately 485,000 doses have been ordered to support the targeted COVID-19 immunization program.
- Based on the Center for Disease Control costing estimates of \$110 per vaccine dose, the cost to taxpayers for the COVID-19 vaccine should not exceed \$49 million, much of which will be offset through cost recovery in phases 3 and 4. The actual cost per dose and for the program is yet to be determined.
- Estimated budget costs for the 2025-26 season are approximately \$2 million for RSV and \$19 million for influenza.



ELDER ABUSE: KNOW THE SIGNS, REDUCE THE RISK

Alberta News, June 13, 2025

Alberta's government is raising awareness about elder abuse and enhancing safety for seniors across the province.

As Alberta's senior population continues to grow, Alberta's government remains steadfast in its commitment to ensuring every Albertan senior can live with dignity, security and free from harm.

Elder abuse is a serious issue worldwide, including in Alberta. It is estimated that one in 10 seniors in the province experiences some form of abuse — an unacceptable reality Alberta's government is determined to change.

Alberta's government is taking action by collaborating with community partners to implement the province's Elder Abuse Prevention Strategy and deliver practical, on-the-ground solutions. Over the next two years, more than \$8 million will be invested in prevention and intervention efforts to protect seniors.

"Seniors are valued members of our communities and deserve to be treated as such. Ending elder abuse requires collective action — all Albertans have a role to play in recognizing the signs of abuse and taking action to spot it, stop it, and reduce the risk." Jason Nixon, Minister of Assisted Living and Social Services

This funding will strengthen initiatives like the Coordinated Community Response Program, expand elder abuse shelter services, and grow the Safe Spaces Program, which increases shelter access for seniors in rural and Indigenous communities by repurposing vacant rooms in seniors' lodges.

"Raising awareness about elder abuse is essential to ensuring the safety and well-being of older adults. Our partnership with the Government of Alberta has strengthened community responses across the province, helping to prevent abuse, support those affected, and build a future where all seniors are treated with dignity and respect." Each year on June 15, communities worldwide observe World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. Many seniors who experience abuse feel ashamed, afraid, or unsure of where to turn to help, and this day serves as a critical opportunity to raise public awareness and encourage open conversations about elder abuse to break the silence. On World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, Alberta's government will launch a province-wide campaign to raise awareness and connect Albertans to available resources. As part of this initiative, survivors of elder abuse have courageously shared their stories to help others know they are not alone, and that help is available. To ensure broad accessibility, campaign materials will be translated into 14 languages.

- In Alberta, elder abuse is defined in as any intentional or reckless act or wilful and negligent disregard, occurring within a relationship of family, trust or dependency, directed at someone 65 years of age or older, that:
 - · causes physical harm
 - · causes emotional or psychological harm
 - involves the misappropriation or misuse of money or other personal possessions or personal or real property
 - subjects an individual to non-consensual sexual contact, activity or behaviour, or
 - fails to provide the necessities of life
- Common signs of elder abuse include:
 - confusion
 - · depression or anxiety
 - unexplained injuries
 - changes in hygiene
 - seeming fearful around certain people
 - fear or worry when talking about money
- Currently, Alberta's senior population is more than 830,000. It is expected to exceed one million by 2035.
