#### Alberta RCMP Serious Crimes Branch conducts arrest in human trafficking investigation

Edmonton, Alta. - In the summer of 2024, Alberta RCMP and Alberta Employment Standards Office received a report of possible human trafficking at a motel in Fox Creek, Alta., and a gas station in Calmar, Alta. The complaint made its way to the Alberta RCMP Serious Crimes Branch who engaged partner agencies such as: Alberta Employment Standards Office, Occupational Health and Safety, Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA), Alberta Occupational Health and Safety, ALERT CFSEU Money Laundering Asset Forfeiture Team (MLAFT), FINTRAC, and Service Canada. Furthermore, ACT (Action, Coalition on Human Trafficking) Alberta is assisting with the survivors of this investigation.

The investigation uncovered multiple illegal business practises involving several immigrant workers. These practices included, but were not limited to:

- Forcing employees to work 80 to 90 hour weeks without proper compensation;
- Submitting falsified work schedules;
- Exploitative payment practices;
- · Overcharging rent and expenses;
- Improper Labour Market Impact Assessment practices; and
- · Harassment.

On June 25, 2025, the Alberta RCMP, assisted by CBSA, executed search warrants at two Edmonton residences seizing cash, bank records, business records and immigration agreements, amongst other offence-related materials.

As a result of the investigation, two individuals were arrested:

- Yeon Soo Lee, a 55-year-old Edmonton resident, was charged with:
  - Trafficking in Persons (x4);
  - Material Benefits from trafficking (x4);
  - Criminal Harassment.
- Joo Hyup Lee, a 26-year-old Edmonton resident, was charged with:
  - Trafficking in Persons; and
  - Material Benefits from trafficking.
- Both individuals have since been released and are set to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Grande Prairie on Aug. 11, 2025.

The investigation is ongoing, with allegations of money laundering still being investigated and authorities actively pursuing all related offences. Investigators are committed to thoroughly uncovering the full scope of the operation and ensuring that all individuals involved are held accountable and that supports are provided for the survivors.

"Human Trafficking is the act of recruiting, transporting, holding individuals by means of force, fraud or coercion for the purpose of sexual or labour exploitation." said Inspector Breanne Brown of the Alberta RCMP Serious Crimes Branch. "In this case, the RCMP determined that the suspects took action to harbour and recruit foreign workers by using threats, abuse of power, fraud and deception, all for the purpose of exploiting the labour of these workers. The Alberta RCMP takes these offences seriously and ask the public to keep an eye out for these individuals who, by the nature of their status and situation, are vulnerable to their oppressors. Those who may have information about Human Trafficking (including sex or labour) are asked to please contact their local police of jurisdiction."

"The Employment Standards branch of Alberta Jobs, Economy, Trade and Immigration investigated multiple businesses owned and operated by Yeon Soo Lee and Joo Hyup Lee for allegations of human trafficking, exploitation of vulnerable workers and violations of the Employment Standards Code" said a message from Employment Standards branch, who often work alongside RCMP in these investigations. "As a result of the investigation, the matter was referred to the RCMP. Employment Standards recovered more than \$160,000 in unpaid earnings for employees and for unauthorized deductions from those earnings. The ministry's Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) branch also conducted inspections of these businesses related to compliance with OHS laws. The inspections and follow-up inspections resulted in a \$60,000 administrative penalty issued to the involved businesses for repeated non-compliance with OHS requirements. A \$10,000 administrative penalty was issued to Yeon Soo Lee for hindering and interfering with an OHS officer".

The Alberta RCMP would also like to take the opportunity to acknowledge the creation of the K Division Human Trafficking Unit in 2023 with the establishment of the Provincial Coordinator role along with the two Special Projects Units in 2024.

Temporary foreign workers or persons on visitor visa's make vulnerable targets for labour trafficking as they are often desperate and looking for opportunities to leave their home country. These persons are often recruited through on-line portals, through immigration companies or word of mouth promising them the opportunity for permanent residency or citizenship in Canada. They are recruited, transported, and harboured by bad employers who hold their identification, control their finances and movements through means of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of forced labour or domestic servitude. When employees complain or try to express concerns, they are often met with threats of penalties or deportation, which keep them from coming forward to police.

These investigations are often done in coordination with the Alberta Employment Standards Office, who wanted to share this message:

The Employment Standards branch of Alberta Jobs, Economy, Trade and Immigration investigated multiple businesses owned and operated by Yeon Soo Lee and Joo Hyup Lee for allegations of human trafficking, exploitation of vulnerable workers and violations of the *Employment Standards Code*. As a result of the investigation, the matter was referred to the RCMP.

Employment Standards recovered more than \$160,000 in unpaid earnings for employees and for unauthorized deductions from those earnings.

The ministry's Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) branch also conducted inspections of these businesses related to compliance with OHS laws. The inspections and follow-up inspections resulted in a \$60,000 administrative penalty issued to 682175 Alberta Ltd., operating as Grizzly Motor Hotel, for repeated non-compliance with OHS requirements. A \$10,000 administrative penalty was issued to Yeon Soo Lee for hindering and interfering with an OHS officer.

# RCMP ARREST DRUG DEALERS

#### Wetaskiwin RCMP arrest Fentanyl drug dealers

Wetaskiwin Alta. – On July 9, 2025 Wetaskiwin RCMP officers from the Wetaskiwin RCMP detachment observed known drug dealers leaving Wetaskiwin. The officers alerted Wetaskiwin Crime Reduction and General Investigation Section members who conducted surveillance of the dealers as they travelled to a residence in Thorsby and observed the vehicle occupants interact with an individual outside the residence. RCMP conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and arrested the occupants. A search warrant was executed on the vehicle revealing 28 grams of suspected Fentanyl as well as pepper spray.

As a result of this stop Daniel Johnson (40), a resident of Wetaskiwin, was charged with;

- · Possession for the purpose of trafficking;
- Failing to comply with release conditions (x3);
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose.

Johnson was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody. His next court date is set for July 15, 2025, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin.

Police continued with their investigation and on July 10, 2025, police executed a search warrant at the earlier Thorsby property. As a result of this search police seized;

- 141 grams of Fentanyl;
- 6.4 grams of Meth.;
- 1.5 grams of Cocaine;
- 2 rifles.

Police arrested and charged Corey Robert David Landry (37), a resident of Edmonton, with:

- Possession for the purpose of trafficking;
- · Possession of property obtained by crime;
- · Careless storage of a firearm;
- Possession of a firearm contrary to prohibition order (x2);
- Possession of a controlled substance (x2).

Landry was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody with his next court date set for July 15, 2025 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin.

"These warrant executions highlight the dedication and reach of the Wetaskiwin Crime Reduction Unit and

General Investigation Section. Our teams continue to work beyond jurisdictional lines to disrupt drug activity and enhance public safety in Wetaskiwin and surrounding communities." Says Cst. Sandhu of the Wetaskiwin Crime Reduction Unit.

# ALBERTA LEADS WITH HEALTH CARE AIDE REGULATION

July 16, 2025, Alberta News

#### Alberta will become the first province to regulate health care aides under a health professional regulatory college, ensuring patients get highquality care from qualified professionals.

Alberta's 40,000 health care aides play a vital role in the health system, providing hands-on support to Albertans who need a high level of care, including seniors and those with chronic or acute illnesses. Starting Feb. 2, 2026, health care aides in Alberta will be regulated under a professional college – just like many other front-line health professionals.

To practise and use the health care aide title, individuals will need to meet approved education requirements, follow standards of practice, commit to ongoing learning and abide by a professional code of ethics.

"This is a major step forward in strengthening Alberta's health care system. It gives Albertans confidence that the care they receive is safe and that health care aides have the proper training and oversight." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Primary and Preventative Health Services

The College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Alberta will become the College of Licensed Practical Nurses and Health Care Aides of Alberta and will be responsible for registering health care aides, setting practice and conduct standards, ensuring continued professional development and responding to complaints. This work builds on the college's experience regulating licensed practical nurses in Alberta.

"The College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Alberta is ready to take on the work of regulating health care aides in a manner that protects the public. We are leveraging our experience as a trusted regulator of licensed practical nurses to prepare health care aides and our partners for this transition. The CLPNA is confident that the interests of Albertans will be served through our oversight of registration, practice, conduct and continuing competence." Kurtis Kooiker, president, College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Alberta

Health care aides who meet the requirements are eligible for enrolment in the Alberta Health Care Aide Directory. Those enrolled in the directory immediately before regulation comes into force will be transferred to a health care aide register with the college and issued a practice permit.

As of Feb. 2, 2026, individuals who meet the requirements for registration as a health care aide, who

intend to provide health care aide services to the public, and who want to use the health care aide title must apply for registration with the College of Licensed Practical Nurses and Health Care Aides of Alberta. Going forward, only registered health care aides will be allowed to use the health care aide title, and all registered health care aides will be required to renew their practice permits annually.

In the weeks ahead, regulatory changes to support implementation will be finalized. The college will also continue working with health care aides, employers, post-secondary institutions and other partners to support a smooth transition.
