Effie Ida Nanninga (Impey)

April 12,1930 - August 11, 2025



Family and friends are sad to announce the passing of Effie Nanninga.

Effie came to Canada from Africa with her family in 1931, and settled in the Breton area.

Effie's brother, George, introduced her to his friend, Fritz Nanninga, when Effie was working in Edmonton at the University Hospital. Effie and Fritz were married in 1949, and after following the oil patch around Alberta, settled in Slave Lake where they raised their 3 daughters.

Wherever she lived, Effie was well known for her unending community service. She was a lifetime member of Royal Purple, and an honorary lifetime member of The Oil Wives Club. Effie held several executive positions over the years with these clubs.

Effie also helped start the first Slave Lake Brownies and Guides, a Home and School Association, and was dedicated to the Anglican Ladies Auxiliary. She and Fritz both worked in the development and construction of Grizzly Ridge Ski Hill, alongside their dear lifetime friends, Jeni and Julian Nash. Effie was Slave Lake's "Citizen of the Year" several times.

When Effie and Fritz retired to Breton, she could often be seen catering at the community hall, advocating and fund raising for community projects, or volunteering with the Breton Seniors and the Ag Society. She was also very passionate about her involvement with the Breton Museum.

In her leisure time, Effie enjoyed gardening, spending time with family, and golfing.

Effie received an Alberta Centennial Medal in 2005, and a Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2013, both for community service.

Effie lost the "love of her life", Fritz, in 2020.

She is also predeceased by her brother and sisters; George Impey, May Sather, Betty Williams, and Annie Deacon.

Effie is survived and will be greatly missed by her daughters, Alice (Wayne), Eileen (Tom), and Nancy (Paul), as well as her brothers and sisters; Mary Pascal, Jim Impey, Frank Block, Walter Block, and Shirley Block and their families, along with the many friends and community members who knew her.

As per her wishes, Effie's ashes will be placed with Fritz at Raven cemetery, with some scattered along the shores of Slave Lake where she spent many happy times with family and friends.

Life and Times of the Thrasher Family

In my last article I wrote about the four spruce trees located south of the Breton Post Office and how they had stood on the property since being planted in 1932 by Lloyd Thrasher, whose family home originally stood on the property. Lloyd wrote an informative article when the Ladder of Time was published in 1980 about the Thrasher family and his time as a young man in the community.

In his article he paid tribute to his mother, Martha, as he mentions men typically received the majority of coverage in many community histories. He describes his mother as a kind and thoughtful person who always put others first. Lloyd was first to admit that she was lucky there was only one prodigal son as he caused his mother a certain amount of grief and anxiety as a spirited teenager.

His father, Fred Thrasher, ran one of the main bush camps for Anthony's Lumber Co. and during the week was away from home. While high jinxes' may have occurred during the week, when his father returned for the weekend, there was penance to pay. His father once presented Lloyd with a brand-new bucksaw and two cords of dry twisted tamarack wood which needed to be cut into firewood length. I am sure Lloyd wasn't impressed with his father's form of a teaching moment by the time he had finished cutting up the wood.

It wasn't all mayhem as the young people of the community, during the 1930's, found many ways to entertain themselves. Lloyd speaks of developing a skating rink in the ravine, sleighing in the winter, swimming in the Modeste Creek and going to local dances. He remembers two halls in Breton and often there was a dance going on in both halls.

Lloyd's first taste of being a working man was in 1934, at age 16, working for Anthony Lumber Co. His job was picking out slabs to be put through the lathe mill to make survey lathe. The weather was hot and work day ten hours long. Lloyd couldn't wait until pay day to collect his wages and dream what he was going to buy with his wages. He was to get his first lesson in the reality of life and business management when he went to collect his wages. Rather than the ten dollars he was expecting it was clearly explained to him by George Matton, the timekeeper for Anthony's, in a very strong accent... "Vot about all the chocolate bars and tobacco you have been drawing from the store? You tink the company going to supply you with dat stuff?" With the coming of the Second World War, Lloyd along with many young men left the community to serve in the armed forces.

In May 1942, tragedy struck the Thrasher family with the death of their daughter Dorothy, just before her 22nd birthday. Dorothy, who had married Vern Waddell, died at the birth of their first child. The funeral obituary for Dorothy indicated that 400 people attended her funeral from the Breton United Church. This was a terrible blow to the family.

The lumbering operation of Anthony Lumber Co. came to an end by 1944 and Fred and Martha would move from Breton, returning to the Carrot Creek area where they had previously resided. Lloyd was stationed on Vancouver Island near the end of the war and when he was discharged from the military, he went to Carrot Creek to help his parents build their retirement home. Lloyd would later move to Vancouver and marry. In 1949 Martha Thrasher passed away. Fred would move to Vancouver after the passing of Martha, to be near his son, and passed away in 1973.

Lloyd returned to Breton for a short visit in 1977, but found many changes had been brought on by the sands of time. The people he had known had moved or passed on, the spruce timber was gone and a Canada Post Office stood where his parent's home had once stood, but those four spruce trees he had planted 45 years previously were still there and would stand for almost another 50 years.

BRAZEAU COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

August 19, 2025 - Regular Council Meeting

Schedule of Fees Bylaw

Council approved Schedule of Fees Bylaw 1214-25, which has updated fees and fines for animal control, as well as a new flat monthly sewer rate for unmetered commercial buildings that were not previously listed.

The bylaw lists the fees and fines for infractions of the Animal Control Bylaw such as dangerous dogs.

Conservation project approval

Council accepted a proposal from Leduc Fish and Game Association to act as stewards of 160 acres of Brazeau County-owned land at NW-36-48-6-W5 as a conservation project, which will be subject to no fee, a 5-year renewal, yearly inspections and prior approval by the Agricultural Fieldman before any onsite improvements and/or work is completed. The property will be used for education and recreation.

The lease holder will be responsible for the care and control of the property under the supervision of Brazeau County staff.

Mayor's Task Force for the Unhoused Committee

Council approved appointing the reeve and alternate (Deputy Reeve Glen Gunderson) to sit on the Mayor's Task Force for the Unhoused Committee, established by the Town of Drayton Valley.

The committee will work to ensure that all options to manage the unhoused situation within the Drayton Valley region have been fully explored and a formal strategy can be established going forward.

Waste Oil Collection

Council approved the purchase of a HAZMAT sea container outfitted with storage to be positioned at the Lindale transfer station for the collection of waste oils and anti-freeze and other materials. The \$60,000 cost of the container will be covered by a grant from the Alberta Recycling Management Authority (ARMA). The container is anticipated to be in place this year.

Village of Breton 2025 Election October 20, 2025

Do you want to make a difference in your community?

This fall you have the chance to do so: not only by the vote you cast for your municipal Councillors, but also by running for municipal office yourself. Here are some things you should consider before you file a nomination paper.

Do I qualify?

To become a candidate you must be:

- at least 18 years old on nomination date
- a Canadian citizen, and
- a resident of the municipality for the six-months preceding nomination day.

You are NOT eligible to be nominated if:

- you are an employee of the municipality, unless granted a leave of absence
- your property taxes are more than \$50 in arrears or you are in default for more than 90 days, or owe any other debt in excess of \$500 to the municipality.

(See the Local Authorities Election Act for further details.)

Do I have the time?

There will be demands on your time. You will be elected for a four-year term and during that time you will be required under the Municipal Government Act to attend:

- Regular Meetings of Council (once a month excluding July and August)
- Meetings of Council Committees (varies but usually a few times per year)
- Meetings of other boards and agencies to which you are appointed as Council's representative (varies from monthly to quarterly but generally one a month)
- ◆ Conferences, conventions, seminars, and workshops for training and discussion (*varies from twice to three times per year*)
- Social and other events promoting your municipality.

Some of these meetings are during the daytime, so it is important to ensure you can get the time off from your employment.

Filing your nomination

September 22, 2025 has been declared nomination day. The completed nomination form is to be filed with the Returning Officer before 12:00 noon this day. Nomination packages can be picked up at the Village office.

Dear Editor,

Cannot bring yourself to buy Mark Carney's book Values? I don't blame you.

Someone found a PDF version that can be downloaded. Know thy enemy. Here's a breakdown for you. Mark Carney's Plan Would Devastate Alberta

Prime Minister Mark Carney makes no secret in his book what the future holds for Alberta's oil and gas industry under his vision of a "net-zero" economy, and it's nothing short of devastating for Alberta.

Carney admits that international climate targets requires that "to meet the 1.5°C target, around 80 per cent of remaining fossil fuels would need to remain in the ground." (p. 295). For Alberta, this means oil sands and other reserves, the backbone of our economy, our communities, and our jobs, would be deliberately written off as worthless.

And this isn't theory. Carney highlights how global giants are already abandoning oil and gas. In 2020, Shell wrote down \$22 billion in assets and BP slashed £11 billion, explicitly citing the energy transition. These are, as he calls them, "public acknowledgements ... of stranded-asset risks" (p. 295). Translation: companies are conceding that much of the oil and gas in the ground will never be developed.

The financial system is following suit. Investors now demand punishingly high returns on oil and gas projects with 10–20% compared to just 3–5% for renewables. Carney admits: "This is structurally constraining the oil and gas industry's ability to invest." (p. 296). That means fewer projects, fewer jobs, and less future for Alberta families.

Carney's so-called solution? Take what's left of Alberta's energy wealth and funnel it into renewables and experimental projects, while the very foundation of our economy is left to rot. He writes that Canada must "reinvest the proceeds of traditional energy sources in the energy opportunities of the future" (p. 491). In other words, Alberta's lifeblood industry is to be bled dry to fund its own replacement.

Make no mistake: behind the leftist Globalist language of "transition" and "sustainability" is a direct threat to the livelihoods of hundreds of thousands of Albertans. Our rigs, our fields, our pipelines, our property all written off. Our communities sacrificed in the name of global targets.

Albertans need to understand what's at stake. This isn't just about climate policy in Ottawa or boardrooms in Europe. It's about whether Alberta's future is decided here at home or stand by and watch as all of it is erased by elites who openly admit that our resources, our jobs, and our way of life must be left "in the ground."






