SCHOOL IS BACK

Today as I worked at the museum, avoiding the heat, and thinking what story might resonate with readers of the Breton Booster, I realized that the school year is only days away from starting. There is a steady stream of parents and their children coming to the Breton Elementary School today and on September 2 the school year begins in earnest.

Since 1927, a school has been located on this site and students have attended school here. As in many communities, the first school was a modest one room building, heated with a wood heater. Stories abound of lunches, carried to school in a Lard pail, and put behind the wood heater in the winter to thaw out. If you want to gross out a young person, or even adults, just tell them drinking water was in a large open water pail, and every one used the same dipper, which was hanging nearby. No individual water bottles in those days. If someone had a cold, good chances everyone was getting a cold.

Over the years, many changes took place, an additional room was added to the first school, and the Antross and Wenham Valley Schools were moved in to accommodate the growing population of students. Breton hit the big times circa 1948, when it was announced that a new school would be built. The headline read... "Begin Building \$16,000 School" ... yes, I have the right number of zeros. The article goes on to indicate the school would have two classrooms, a science room and full basement with a furnace. Also, a water well was being drilled, which would alleviate the need to carry drinking water to the school. I am not sure, but likely the water pail and dipper continued for a while. When it opened this school housed the Junior Senior High classes, today it is home to the Breton Museum. Long time Museum Board members, Tom Impey and Bill Flesher, were two of the students when it opened. When I showed Bill the news article about the building of the new school and the cost, he replied... "well you have to realize there was no electrical or plumbing costs included in that price".

Changes continued to happen, the first part of what is the Breton Elementary School was constructed in the early 1950's. The baby boom generation was now becoming school age and the number of students were increasing, a trend that would continue for the next two decades or more. In the mid 1950's ten acres of land, on the east side of Breton, was purchased from the Huntley estate for school expansion. This would become the Junior/Senior High School site. Various expansions and modernizations at both the Elementary School and the High School would take place over the next several decades.

Until the 1966-67 school term both the Elementary and High school were under one administration, but due to increased student enrollment and likely different locations, the school became two separate entities each with their own administration. Now with the modernization of the Breton High School well under way the renovated school will become a Kindergarten-Grade 12 school when completed. They say that history has a way of repeating itself and Breton Schools are headed back to one school with one administration just at a different site.

So, on Tuesday morning please look out for the safety of the students as they return to start a new school year.



INTERNATIONAL OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY

Alberta News, August 31, 2025

Minister of Mental Health and Addiction Rick Wilson issued the following statement on International Overdose Awareness Day:

"Every life lost to addiction is a heartbreaking reminder of the weight of this crisis. Our government stands with families and communities in grief, and we remain committed to expanding access to care and support. Recovery is possible for everyone.

"We continue to make record investments in addiction and mental health services, building a comprehensive continuum of recovery-oriented care. Since 2019, our government has created more than 10,000 new publicly funded treatment spaces, increasing the supply from 19,000 to more than 29,000 spaces – an increase of 55 percent. We've removed user fees for live-in addiction treatment and expanded access to same-day support through the Virtual Opioid Dependency Program, ensuring cost or location is never a barrier to care. We have also proudly opened doors to four of Alberta's world-class recovery communities, with seven more set to open within the next couple of years. This includes five in partnership with First Nations and Métis communities.

"Over the past year, we've seen encouraging signs that Alberta's recovery-focused approach is delivering a positive impact. Opioid-related deaths dropped by more than a third in 2024 compared with 2023 – and the first five months of 2025 are showing fewer opioid-related deaths than the same time period last year. Deaths linked to methamphetamine, pharmaceutical-related opioids and alcohol have also declined significantly.

"More Albertans than ever are accessing same-day treatment through the Virtual Opioid Dependency Program, with more than 12,000 clients enrolled in Recovery Alberta's opioid treatment services in 2024.

"Anyone suffering from addiction is also encouraged to download the Digital Overdose Response System app – a confidential and free tool which connects you with emergency services should you become unresponsive while using drugs alone. Naloxone kits are also available for pick up at pharmacies across the province.

"If you or someone you know is struggling, please reach out. Help is available. For information about services in your community, dial 211 Alberta. You are not alone – recovery is possible."



UPDATED FALL VACCINE ROLLOUT

Alberta News, August 22, 2025

Alberta's fall immunization program will roll out in two phases to help protect those most at risk of severe outcomes from COVID-19.

Alberta's government is updating its fall COVID-19 vaccine program into a new two-phase plan starting in October to streamline access to immunization. Phase 1 provides free vaccines to eligible Albertans, while Phase 2 makes vaccines available to everyone else for an administration fee.

"We are striking a balance between protecting vulnerable Albertans and preventing vaccine wastage. We remain committed to ensuring Albertans who are at a higher risk of severe outcomes from COVID-19 have access to vaccines." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Primary and Preventative Health Services

Health care workers are now also eligible for COVID-19 immunization as part of Phase 1. Offering the vaccine to health care workers helps protect vulnerable patients and maintain a strong workforce, ensuring the health system can continue delivering safe, effective care.

Those eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine free of charge in Phase 1 includes:

- all residents of continuing care homes and seniors supportive living accommodations
- · home care clients
- individuals six months of age and older with underlying medical conditions and compromised immune systems, as recommended by the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI)
- · health care workers
- · individuals experiencing homelessness
- individuals 65 and older receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit

All Albertans can use the Alberta Vaccine Booking System at www.alberta.ca until Sept. 30 to register for COVID-19 immunizations. Those who pre-order will receive a text or email notification in October to book an appointment and confirm eligibility. Pre-ordering for the 2025-26 season also allows Albertans to pre-order their vaccine for the 2026-27 season. Albertans who do not pre-order by Sept. 30 can still book a COVID-19 vaccine appointment once vaccines become available in October.

Pre-booking helps reduce vaccine wastage and ensures taxpayer dollars are used wisely. During the 2024–25 respiratory virus season, about 401,000 doses went unused or expired, costing over \$44 million based on the Center for Disease Control estimated cost of a single vaccine dose.

The federal government discontinued funding beginning in the 2025 respiratory virus season. Alberta is now

managing its own supply and is focused on protecting vulnerable Albertans while minimizing waste. In Phase 2, COVID-19 vaccines will be available to all other Albertans, who will be required to pay an administration fee to receive the vaccine. The administration fee will be \$100 per dose.

Phase 1 appointments for eligible Albertans will begin on Oct. 1. Phase 2 appointments for all other Albertans, pending vaccine availability, are expected to begin on Oct. 20. Appointments will remain open for booking for those in both phases as long as supplies last or until the end of the respiratory virus season.

Vaccines will be provided to most Albertans only through public health clinics in the province. Select pharmacists will be able to provide immunizations at continuing care and assisted living facilities through existing arrangements.

Albertans are encouraged to speak with their primary care provider to determine the best immunization plan for their needs.

Quick facts:

- The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) currently recommends additional doses of COVID-19 vaccine for specific populations.
- For those not at increased risk, vaccination is discretionary. NACI cites analysis from Canada, the U.S. and the U.K. showing publicly funded vaccination of the general public would not be cost-effective based on the expected benefit.
- NACI updated its recommendation regarding the minimum interval between COVID-19 vaccine doses to three months from six months to allow for maximum flexibility around timing. Alberta Health is now following the three-month recommendation.
- As of April 1, Alberta has taken over the responsibility for procuring and funding COVID-19 vaccines for the province. Alberta has procured COVID-19 vaccines through the National Bulk Purchasing Program.
- For the 2025-26 season, about 485,000 doses have been ordered to support the targeted COVID-19 immunization program.
- Last year, 13.7 per cent of Albertans received a COVID vaccination.
- The RSV immunization is available to all Albertans over aged 70 at no cost, and available to all other Albertans for purchase.
- The influenza vaccine remains available to all Albertans



NUCLEAR IN THE MIX FOR ALBERTA'S ENERGY FUTURE

Alberta News, August 25, 2025

Alberta's government is inviting Albertans, Indigenous communities and industry to join the conversation on nuclear energy in the province.

Alberta is launching a public engagement to explore nuclear energy's potential to meet the future needs of families, businesses and communities. As part of the first phase, Alberta's government is appointing an expert panel to engage with people across the province, as well as launching a public survey to help inform a nuclear energy roadmap for Alberta.

With increasing demand for electricity, fuelled by population growth, many jurisdictions in Canada and around the world are advancing nuclear energy development. As a source of safe, reliable, emissions-free energy, nuclear power has emerged as a viable option for growing energy needs while supporting responsible decarbonization goals. It also has the potential to enhance grid reliability and affordability, create jobs and help power new, energy-intensive industries and technologies.

"Alberta is at the centre of Canada's growth, and with that growth comes the responsibility to secure the next generation of energy. Nuclear power has the potential to expand our grid, support new industries and keep pace with rising demand. This engagement gives Albertans a real voice in shaping our future, while positioning our province to lead the way in innovative, responsible energy development." Danielle Smith, Premier

"As demand for electricity grows, affordability and reliability must remain at the heart of our system. Exploring nuclear energy is about ensuring Albertans have access to dependable, emissions-free power that can support families, businesses and communities for generations." The Nuclear Energy Engagement and Advisory Panel will lead a range of engagement activities, gather input and deliver a report with recommendations on how Alberta could enable a nuclear energy industry. The panel will be chaired by Affordability and Utilities Parliamentary Secretary Chantelle de Jonge and includes five additional members with diverse experience and leadership in industry, academia and Indigenous government:

- Deron Bilous, senior vice-president of Western Canada, Counsel Public Affairs
- · Tim Boston, principal, Boston Edge Strategies Inc.
- Stephen Buffalo, president and CEO, Indian Resource Council of Canada
- Rudiger Tscherning, fellow on Nuclear Law and Policy,

University of Calgary

 Harrie Vredenburg, professor of Strategy and Global Management, University of Calgary

"Nuclear power has the potential to play an important part in meeting Alberta's future energy needs. I'm proud to lead a panel that will provide people in Alberta with the opportunity to have their say and shape the future of energy in our province." Chantelle de Jonge, parliamentary secretary, Affordability and Utilities

The Nuclear Energy Development survey is available online and will be open until Sept. 25. Feedback will inform future engagement activities. Alberta's government has also proactively reached out to Indigenous communities across the province to help determine the best approach for meaningful engagement and to foster early relationship building. Industry, municipalities, Indigenous communities and others are also invited to share their input through an online request for information which will be open until Oct. 25.

The next phase of engagement will feature in-person meetings and engagement sessions with Indigenous communities, municipalities and industry and begin later this year. Engagement activities will continue into 2026.


