

NO MORE FLYERS AT CANADA POST

Canada Post Website, September 12, 2025

The Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) announced it will introduce a ban on the delivery of Neighbourhood Mail starting Monday, September 15 at 12:01 am local time. The ban applies to unaddressed direct mail (Neighbourhood Mail) only. Addressed items (Personalized Mail, Postal Code Targeting Mail and Transactional Mail) and parcels will not be affected.

What this means for your business

As a result of the union's action, we have made the difficult decision to stop accepting Neighbourhood Mail items effective immediately.

This means that until further notice, no Neighbourhood Mail items will be accepted for drop-off at plants, depots, post offices or other Canada Post facilities. All delivery vehicles intending to drop off Neighbourhood Mail will be turned away. In addition, items currently in the network will be securely held.

Please note that all other Canada Post products continue to be processed and delivered as normal.

Our commitment to you

We understand the ongoing labour uncertainty is creating significant challenges for your business, especially as you prepare for the holiday season. We're committed to keeping you informed so you can make timely, informed business decisions.

We are disappointed in CUPW's decision to ban the delivery of Neighbourhood Mail, which we first learned about through their news conference. This decision impacts the thousands of Canadian businesses that reach their customers with information and offers through the mail. It also impacts CUPW-represented employees who are paid to deliver flyers on top of their wages.

We remain committed to reaching new collective agreements through the bargaining process that provide long-term certainty for your business, while evolving our delivery model to meet your changing needs and those of your customers.





 - a. The full purchase price if it is \$10,000 or less; OR
 - b. If the purchase price is greater than \$10,000, the purchaser must provide a non-refundable deposit in the amount of \$10,000 and the balance of the purchase price must be paid within 20 days of the sale.

(if the certified cheque or bank draft exceeds the final purchase price, the excess will be refunded within a reasonable time)

- 8. GST will be collected on all properties subject to GST.
- 9. The risk of the property lies with the purchaser immediately following the auction.
- 10. The purchaser is responsible for obtaining vacant possession.
- 11. The purchaser will be responsible for registration of the transfer including registration fees.
- 12. If no offer is received on a property or if the reserve bid is not met, the property cannot be sold at the public auction.
- 13. The municipality may, after the public auction, become the owner of any parcel of land that is not sold at the public auction.
- 14. Once the property is declared sold at public auction, the previous owner has no further right to pay the tax arrears.



DRAYTON VALLEY ARRESTS

RCMP Alberta News, September 9, 2025

Drayton Valley RCMP property crime initiative results in multiple arrests

Drayton Valley, Alta. - Over the past couple of months, after receiving multiple complaints regarding motor vehicle theft, the Drayton Valley RCMP began an initiative targeting property crime offenders. As a result, there have been a few noteworthy investigations that the Drayton Valley RCMP would like to share:

- On Aug. 17, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP attempted to stop a suspicious vehicle in Drayton Valley. The driver fled from police but RCMP officers were able to identify the driver as a known suspended driver and prolific property crime offender in the area. On Aug. 27, 2025, the Drayton Valley General Investigation Section (GIS) and the Central Alberta District (CAD) Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) executed a search warrant on a rural property in Alder Flats, Alta. Police seized the vehicle that was being operated on the date of the original offence as well as a second vehicle that has been confirmed to be stolen. As a result of the investigation, Jason Roy (38), a resident of Alder Flats, was arrested and charged with:
 - · Flight from police;
 - Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle;
 - · Operation of a motor vehicle while prohibited; and
 - Possession of property obtained by crime.

Roy was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Sept. 16, 2025.

- On Aug. 19, 2025, CAD CRU and Drayton Valley RCMP GIS were able to locate a wanted male in a rural location West of Drayton Valley. A search warrant was executed, resulting in the seizure of:
 - · Four stolen trucks;
 - A stolen holiday trailer;
 - A stolen Side-by-Side ATV;
 - A stolen guad ATV: and
 - Several firearms, two of which were later confirmed to be stolen.

As a result of the investigation, Kenneth Caron (33) and Yvonne Rheaume (23) were arrested. Both were charged with the below offences, with Caron being additionally charged with Possession of a firearm or prohibited weapon contrary order (x5) and failure to comply with a release order(x5):

- Possession of property obtained by crime (x9);
- Possession of a firearm without holding a licence (x4);
- Possession of a stolen firearm (x2); and
- · Possession of a prohibited weapon.

Caron and Rheaume were brought before a justice of the peace where Caron was remanded and Rheaume released. They are both to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Sept. 16, 2025.

- On Aug. 28, 2025, Drayton Valley RCMP conducted a traffic stop on a suspicious vehicle in Drayton Valley. During the course of the investigation, police determined that the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) on the dash of the vehicle did not match the one on the doors. Police queries on the door VIN revealed the doors to be from a stolen vehicle. Further investigation revealed the location of the stolen vehicle with its two missing doors. A 43-year-old male Drayton Valley resident was arrested and will be charged with Possession of property obtained by crime, though the information has yet to be sworn. The male was released by way of an Appearance Notice and is next scheduled to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on Oct. 21, 2025.
- On Sept 5, 2025, after a three-months long investigation, the Drayton Valley RCMP GIS, with the assistance of the RCMP Auto Theft Unit, executed a search warrant on a "Chop Shop" near Drayton Valley. As a result of the search, police located and seized:
 - A large quantity of parts from four different stolen vehicles in various states of disassembly, with stolen parts mounted on non-stolen vehicles;
 - · Afirearm:
 - · Ammunition:
 - · A stolen safe;
 - A stolen ID card:
 - Methamphetamine; and
 - Cocaine.

Michael Tymchak (43) was arrested and charged with:

- · Break and enter and commit theft;
- Possession of property obtained by crime (x9);
- · Possession of identity documents;
- Possession of a firearm without holding a licence;
- Possession of a firearm or ammunition contrary to order (x3); and
- Possession of a controlled substance (x2).

Tymchak was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Breton on Sept. 10, 2025.

"The Drayton Valley RCMP remains committed to the investigation and prosecution of individuals that engage in property crime in and around the community of Drayton Valley" said Cpl. Cam Turner, the NCO i/c of the Drayton Valley RCMP GIS. "These criminal offences victimize members of the community and often can lead to lost wages and out of pocket expenses for victims of these crimes. The Drayton Valley RCMP will continue to ensure that persons who choose to engage in criminal activity and prey on members of the community will be located and dealt with according to law."

EDUCATION NEGOTIATIONS UPDATE

Alberta News, September 15, 2025

President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance Nate Horner issued the following statement about the ongoing negotiations with TEBA and the ATA:

"After announcing its intention to strike last week, the ATA provided its members with a document titled 'Talking Points' for teachers to use when speaking to parents and students about the current bargaining situation.

"The document falsely claims that the Teachers' Employer Bargaining Association (TEBA) does not have the mandate to 'negotiate on important issues such as class complexity, class size, support for students.'

"There are also other statements in the document that are misleading and confusing for parents, teachers and most importantly our kids, who are explicitly targeted by these communications.

"To be clear, the only item outstanding between the ATA and TEBA for a new contract is the union's additional salary demands.

"TEBA's most recent offer to the ATA included a guarantee to hire 3,000 more teachers over the next three years at a cost of about three-quarters of a billion dollars. This is what the ATA asked for in its previous offer and government's response met that request. The parties are no longer disputing negotiations on that point.

"The current offer provides a salary increase of at least 12 per cent over four years with more than 95 per cent of teachers receiving more through a market adjustment, and would result in the best deal for teachers in all of Western Canada.

"The information in the ATA document is inaccurate. It intentionally misinforms the public, parents and students. TEBA has been left with no choice but to launch a legal challenge. The Alberta Labour Relations Board received our complaint today, asking the ATA and its president Jason Schilling to immediately retract their false claims and to stop using Alberta's students and families for leverage in a bargaining dispute.

"The ATA's leadership and communications strategy targeting families and children with false and misleading claims raises serious ethical concerns. The government must now correct the false narrative the ATA has created.

"I look forward to a speedy resolution of this complaint with the Labour Relations Board. When we have our resolution, we will consider next steps."

KICKSTARTING CAREERS FOR YOUNG ALBERTANS

Alberta News, September 11, 2025

A new youth hiring incentive is launching to help young Albertans get experience, build confidence and gain skills to launch rewarding careers.

Alberta's government is providing \$8 million for the new Alberta Youth Employment Incentive, which will provide grants to employers to offset costs associated with hiring, training and employing youth from age 15-24. The initiative is expected to support around 1,000 businesses to hire 2,500 young Albertans.

Entering the workforce is a vital first step toward building a strong, lifelong career. Youth unemployment is a challenge across Canada, and with a youth unemployment rate of 17 per cent, Alberta especially feels the impact as the result of rapid population growth through international immigration and the highest interprovincial migration of any other province. Young Albertans deserve access to jobs that help them learn, grow and contribute.

"Young Albertans deserve to be first in line for the kinds of jobs that open doors and build confidence. The Alberta Youth Employment Incentive gives employers a reason to take a chance on youth and help them gain the experience that leads to lifelong careers. This is how we prepare the next generation to succeed in every sector and build a stronger Alberta for tomorrow." Danielle Smith, Premier

"Investing in young Albertans is instrumental to building a stronger future for everyone. The Alberta Youth Employment Incentive will not only open opportunities for youth, but also support fresh, young talent entering the province's business and professional marketplace. Our goal is to ensure all Albertans, including youth, have the training, skills and support they need to thrive and be active contributors in Alberta's workforce." Joseph Schow, Minister of Jobs, Economy, Trade and **Immigration**

Beginning in October 2025, employers will be eligible for one of two incentive amounts. Those who hire 1-2 young workers for a combined total of at least 400 hours, will be eligible to receive \$4,000. Employers who hire 3-5 young workers with a combined total of at least 750 hours, will be eligible to receive \$7,500. Through this initiative, Alberta's government is helping pay \$10 of the hourly wage for young workers.

The Alberta Youth Employment Incentive will be managed by CAREERS – a long-standing not-for-profit organization that helps young people connect with

employment. CAREERS will be responsible for delivering grants, determining eligibility and ensuring employers have the information they need if questions arise regarding the initiative. Once the incentive is available, applications by employers will be made through the CAREERS website.

In addition to the grant funding, Alberta's government is helping employers build confidence in young workers by developing a digital badge for youth who have worked a minimum of 200 hours and pass a skills-verified employer assessment. This badge can be highlighted on resumes, helping businesses know they are hiring a young person who has demonstrated and developed meaningful skills in a workplace.

"Helping youth and young adults enter the workforce is an important first step in their careers. With this new hiring incentive, we are excited that more young Albertans, including many of our students, will start gaining the experience they need for a successful future." The Alberta youth hiring incentive builds on the continued work to support a strong workforce in Alberta, which was set in motion with the recently announced Alberta Jobs Strategy. By empowering employers to hire youth, Alberta is building a stronger, more resilient workforce and economy for the future.

Albertans will soon access their health records under a new name as MyAHS Connect is rebranded to MyChart, creating a seamless online health experience.

As part of the action the government is taking to move the health system forward, MyAHS Connect is being renamed MyChart. This change provides a clearer, more consistent name that aligns with the MyChart mobile app and supports a patient-focused digital health system. It lets Albertans securely access their personal health information, manage appointments, view test results and co-ordinate care with their health team.

MyChart draws its information primarily from Connect Care and the acute care system, providing Albertans with a reliable, up-to-date view of their health records in one place. This integration across care settings helps patients and their health teams co-ordinate treatment and make informed decisions.

"We want to ensure Albertans have straightforward access to their health records, and throughout our efforts to refocus the health system, creating a seamless patient journey has remained a key priority." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Primary and Preventative Health Services

"Renaming MyAHS Connect to MyChart will ensure a consistent name between the app and the system while maintaining its important function as an online collaborative tool for both Albertans and healthcare professionals." Matt Jones, Minister of Hospital and Surgical Health Services

Alberta's government began refocusing the health care system to create a more integrated system that provides improved care to all Albertans – and this includes access to health records important to making decisions about one's individual health care needs. Currently, MyChart is used in both the acute care and mental health and addiction pillars of the health care system. Work is underway to determine how MyChart can be expanded in other care settings across the province.

Albertans can get started with MyChart today by signing up through MyHealth Alberta or downloading the free mobile app, giving them secure, convenient access to their health information and connecting them with their care team.

Quick facts

 Albertans can access MyChart by creating a verified Alberta.ca account and signing up for MyHealth Records.

- Through MyChart, patients can view their Connect Care health information from a desktop, smartphone, or tablet
- Existing users automatically retain access and all patient information remains in MyChart – no new sign-up is required.

- Albertans who are 14 years and older, who have a verified Alberta.ca account and access to their MyHealth Records account can access MyChart.


