

TEACHERS SET TO STRIKE OCTOBER 6 IF SETTLEMENT NOT REACHED

The Alberta Teachers' Association (ATA) announced on September 10 that the teachers will be on strike October 6 if a deal isn't reached between the ATA and the Teachers' Employer Bargaining Association (TEBA). ATA staff includes all teachers, principals and assistant principals.

President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance Nate Horner also issued a statement on September 10 stating that TEBA and the ATA will be returning to the bargaining table to continue negotiations. He commented that "announcing a strike commencing October 6 before the parties have resumed negotiations only serves to increase stress among Alberta's students and families."

In an ATA news release on September 10, here is what they had to say while they announced the strike notice:

"What teachers want is simple: classrooms that are properly funded and wages that reflect their value to Alberta's future. For the government to state that teachers would sacrifice their students' learning conditions for salary is insulting. Teachers should not have to choose one or the other." ATA president Jason Schilling

Teachers have continually been disrespected and vilified by this government—a government that creates distractions that downplay the real issues in our classrooms, while teachers are still being asked to do more with less. Teachers' patience has run out.

The province must step up with a fair deal that shows a real commitment to teachers and public education. We are ready to meet at the table and have invited TEBA to join us.

"Let me be clear—October 6 is coming quickly. The choice is theirs: solve this dispute now or face a provincewide teachers' strike." ATA president Jason Schilling

The Alberta Teachers' Association, as the professional organization of teachers, promotes and advances public

education, supports teachers' professional practice and serves as the advocate for its 51,000 members.

On September 5 in a news release, Minister Horner commented that on August 26, Teachers' Employer Bargaining Association (TEBA) proposed a settlement that agreed to provide the hiring commitment requested by the ATA - hiring 3,000 new teachers over the course of the three school years of the agreement. TEBA's proposal additionally included a similar compensation offer that was previously recommended by the ATA to their members. In the same news release on September 5, here is what the government had to say:

"Hiring 3,000 teachers would have cost about threequarters of a billion dollars over the three years. According to the ATA themselves, it would have helped alleviate population growth and classroom complexity pressures, especially in elementary schools, something that teachers have said is a top priority for them.

"The cost of the current proposed deal over the full term, is over \$2.3 billion, which includes substantial raises for teachers. While the general wage increase is 12 per cent over four years, just like the other negotiated deals with the nurses and public sector workers, over 95 per cent of teachers would receive more through market adjustments, depending on their region and role.

"Last week, I shared the first quarter fiscal update and economic statement and mentioned that 2025 has brought its share of challenges for everyone. We are now forecasting a \$6.5 billion deficit, our first deficit in five years. Considering our fiscal update, making room for \$750 million was not going to be easy, but we were committed to reaching a fair deal for teachers and stability for students and families.

"While union leaders reconsider their tactics, TEBA remains ready to return to the table to secure a fair agreement. Our government is committed to a responsible outcome that balances the needs of teachers, families and taxpayers alike.

More to come as information is provided.







Minister of Mental Health and Addiction Rick Wilson and Minister of Children and Family Services Searle Turton issued the following statement on World Suicide Prevention Day:

Today, on World Suicide Prevention Day, we stand together to remember those we have lost, support those who are struggling and reaffirm our commitment to building a province where every Albertan knows they are not alone.

Suicide is a complex issue, but it is preventable. Behind every statistic is a person – a loved one, a friend or a neighbour – whose life matters. That's why Alberta's government continues to take bold, compassionate action to strengthen mental health supports across the province.

We are investing in initiatives that help Albertans build resilience, develop recovery capital and access safe, evidence-based supports focussed on recovery. These include services like 211 Alberta, partnering with Counselling Alberta to provide affordable counselling options across the province and youth-focused supports such as CASA Mental Health classrooms and youth mental health hubs.

"To anyone who is struggling – please know that help is available, and recovery is possible. A call to Counselling Alberta could provide the support needed for yourself or a loved one who is struggling" Rick Wilson, Minister of Mental Health and Addiction

Edmonton – This September, your Alberta RCMP is providing tips to help avoid becoming a victim of cybercrime.

Cybercrime refers to criminal activity in which the Internet and information technologies, such as computers, tablets, and mobile devices, have a substantial role in the commission of a criminal offence.

To help avoid becoming a victim of cybercrime, practice the below tips:

- **Use strong passwords:** Avoid simple, easily guessable passwords and use a unique password for each account. Consider using a password manager that can store and manage your passwords.
- Enable multi-factor authentication: Add extra security to your accounts by enabling multi-factor authentication whenever available.
- Update software: Keep your operating system, browsers, and applications up to date to avoid security vulnerabilities.
- Secure your computer: Activate your firewall, use anti-virus/malware software, and block spyware attacks by installing and updating anti-spyware software.
- Secure your network: Secure your home's wireless network. Do not use public Wi-Fi for financial or corporate transactions.
- Be social media savvy: Ensure your social networking profiles are set to private. Be careful about what you post online.
- Protect your e-identity: Be cautious about giving personal information on the Internet. Make sure that websites are secure and that you've enabled privacy settings.
- Avoid scams: Always think before clicking a link or file from an unknown origin. Don't feel pressured by emails or messages. Verify the source of each message and never reply to emails requesting user IDs and passwords.

DATA SHOWS CARFENTANIL-RELATED OVERDOSES INCREASING IN EDMONTON

AHS News, Public Service Announcement, September 10, 2025

EDMONTON – Recovery Alberta is warning illicit drugs in Edmonton should be assumed to contain carfentanil and be considered extremely dangerous.

Data from the <u>Alberta Substance Use Surveillance</u> <u>System (ASUSS)</u> shows a trend of week-over-week increases in opioid-related emergencies, specifically in the Edmonton region.

In the week of August 25, Emergency Health Services (EHS) responded to 321 opioid-related events.

- This is a 39 per cent increase from the previous week (approx. 231 the previous week).
- Edmonton accounted for 73 per cent of the total weekly responses (approx. 234 calls).

Weekly EHS numbers can vary, and more calls don't always indicate more deaths. However, the growing presence of carfentanil in opioid-related deaths is very concerning, especially in Edmonton.

- From January to May 2025, 68 per cent of opioid deaths in Alberta involved carfentanil—up from 10 per cent in 2024.
- In Edmonton, that number has jumped from 17 per cent to 78 per cent.
- 88 per cent of all carfentanil-related deaths in Alberta during that period took place in Edmonton.

Carfentanil is extremely potent—up to 100,000 times stronger than morphine and over 100 times stronger than fentanyl, according to the <u>Canadian Centre of Recovery Excellence (CoRE)</u>. It is not approved for human use and is only legal for large animal sedation by veterinarians.

- Microgram-level amounts can cause life-threatening overdoses.
- Naloxone can help, but multiple doses may be needed to reverse its effects.
 - Each naloxone kit, available at most pharmacies, contains a single dose.
- Opioid agonist treatment (OAT) remains the standard approach – there are no carfentanil-specific treatments.

Recovery Alberta continues to expand access to OAT—a proven, life-saving alternative to illicit opioid use. OAT helps stabilize people, reduce cravings, and prevent overdose.

As part of this effort, advanced care paramedics in EHS' Mobile Integrated Healthcare program can give first-line OAT medications right in the community. This means faster care, better outcomes, and more chances for individuals to be connected with life saving treatment.

In addition, an emergency response team is currently in place to monitor clients in and around Hope Mission's Herb Jamieson Centre. This team of primary care paramedics, nurses and health care aides are responding to mental health and addiction crises including overdoses and other health emergencies. With additional provincial funding, this team is increasing its operations to 24 hours, 7 days a week (up from 12 hours, 7 days a week) in response to the increase in carfentanil related overdoses in Edmonton.

Edmonton Police Service (EPS) is an important partner in responding to the addiction crisis. Through their Human-centred Engagement and Liaison Partnership (HELP) teams, EPS is able to help individuals access recovery-oriented health supports and programs such as the Virtual Opioid Dependency Program (VODP).

The DORS app can be downloaded from any smart phone's app store, or through the links available on www.DORSApp.ca.


