

ALBERTA FIRST TO ADD CITIZENSHIP TO LICENSES

Alberta News, September 15, 2025

Alberta is the first province to add a Canadian citizenship marker to driver's licences and ID cards, giving residents a single, secure card to access programs and services.

This fall, legislation will be introduced to implement the addition of Canadian citizenship status to Albertans' drivers licences or ID cards. This change is part of a broader initiative to give Albertans a single, secure document that confirms both identity and Canadian citizenship. By combining identity and citizenship on one document, Albertans will no longer need to carry multiple pieces of ID to access services.

Adding a Canadian citizenship marker to Alberta's drivers licenses will also strengthen Alberta's election system by helping ensure that only eligible citizens cast ballots, protecting the integrity of our democratic process. It also positions Alberta to respond quickly to future legislative changes and aligns with international standards.

This modernization builds on recently announced changes to incorporate Alberta health care numbers onto drivers licenses in late 2026. Currently, there are more than half a million more health care numbers registered than there are people living in Alberta, based on second quarter 2025 population estimates. Through this process, Alberta's government will be able to identify which health care cards continue to be actively in use and better understand why there is such a large discrepancy.

Key facts:

- The citizenship marker will be added to all new and renewed drivers licences and ID cards starting in fall 2026, ensuring a consistent and reliable way to verify citizenship across Alberta.
- There will be no additional cost to Albertans to add citizenship, beyond the existing cost of obtaining a drivers license.
- Beginning in 2026, individuals will be required to bring proof of citizenship or immigration status to obtain or renew a drivers license.
- Only Canadian citizenship will be displayed on drivers licenses or ID cards.

EDUCATION NEGOTIATIONS

President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance Nate Horner issued the following statement about the ongoing negotiations with TEBA and the ATA on September 15, 2025

"After announcing its intention to strike last week, the ATA provided its members with a document titled 'Talking Points' for teachers to use when speaking to parents and students about the current bargaining situation.

"The document falsely claims that the Teachers' Employer Bargaining Association (TEBA) does not have the mandate to 'negotiate on important issues such as class complexity, class size, support for students.'

"There are also other statements in the document that are misleading and confusing for parents, teachers and most importantly our kids, who are explicitly targeted by these communications.

"To be clear, the only item outstanding between the ATA and TEBA for a new contract is the union's additional salary demands.

"TEBA's most recent offer to the ATA included a guarantee to hire 3,000 more teachers over the next three years at a cost of about three-quarters of a billion dollars. This is what the ATA asked for in its previous offer and government's response met that request. The parties are no longer disputing negotiations on that point.

"The current offer provides a salary increase of at least 12 per cent over four years with more than 95 per cent of teachers receiving more through a market adjustment, and would result in the best deal for teachers in all of Western Canada.

"The information in the ATA document is inaccurate. It intentionally misinforms the public, parents and students. TEBA has been left with no choice but to launch a legal challenge. The Alberta Labour Relations Board received our complaint today, asking the ATA and its president Jason Schilling to immediately retract their false claims and to stop using Alberta's students and families for leverage in a bargaining dispute.

"The ATA's leadership and communications strategy targeting families and children with false and misleading claims raises serious ethical concerns. The government must now correct the false narrative the ATA has created.

"I look forward to a speedy resolution of this complaint with the Labour Relations Board. When we have our resolution, we will consider next steps.

The Alberta Teacher's Association issued the following on September 15 "In response to bad faith bargaining complaint"

The government's legal challenge is regarding a communication sent to teachers on August 29. They now object to our observation that

the government has not provided the Teachers' Employer Bargaining Association (TEBA) with the mandate to negotiate on important issues—such as class complexity, class size, supports for students and violence-free classrooms—to improve the learning environment for students and teachers.

The fact is that government negotiators have consistently stated in bargaining that they lack the "mandate," the money and political authority, to address both teachers' concerns about classroom learning conditions and expectations for adequate compensation.

Let's be clear: what we said is not misconduct, it's not misleading—it's the truth.

Rather than sitting down at the table and working toward a solution, the government is wasting time on legal maneuvers and public smears.

Let's not lose sight of what's really happening here: classrooms are bursting at the seams, teachers are overworked and overwhelmed, and our public education system is crumbling before our eyes.

What we're asking for is a solid foundation for a quality education system and a salary that reflects the demands that have been placed on teachers.

When we say that, we're not spinning. We're telling the truth.



NO MORE FLYERS AT CANADA POST

Canada Post Website, September 12, 2025

The Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) announced it will introduce a ban on the delivery of Neighbourhood Mail starting Monday, September 15 at 12:01 am local time. The ban applies to unaddressed direct mail (Neighbourhood Mail) only. Addressed items (Personalized Mail, Postal Code Targeting Mail and Transactional Mail) and parcels will not be affected.

What this means for your business

As a result of the union's action, we have made the difficult decision to stop accepting Neighbourhood Mail items effective immediately.

This means that until further notice, no Neighbourhood Mail items will be accepted for drop-off at plants, depots, post offices or other Canada Post facilities. All delivery vehicles intending to drop off Neighbourhood Mail will be turned away. In addition, items currently in the network will be securely held.

Please note that all other Canada Post products continue to be processed and delivered as normal.

We understand the ongoing labour uncertainty is creating significant challenges for your business, especially as you prepare for the holiday season. We're committed to keeping you informed so you can make timely, informed business decisions.

We are disappointed in CUPW's decision to ban the delivery of Neighbourhood Mail, which we first learned about through their news conference. 
